**Milton, FL –** The Tobacco-Free Santa Rosa Coalition will meet at 4:00 p.m. Thursday, January 28, in the main conference room of the Florida Department of Health in Santa Rosa County, 5527 Stewart Street in Milton. Topics will include a presentation on Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems by tobacco prevention specialist Gina Rosso, coordinator for Students Working Against Tobacco (SWAT) of Santa Rosa County, an update of Bureau of Tobacco Free Florida national and local policy trends from the December 2015 Tobacco Summit, the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) ruling concerning smoke-free policies for all subsidized housing and an update on community events in the coming year.
